Amy Parker, NC State OTCNV (top left): *As the New Ventures Associate, Amy supports and manages OTCNV's Chancellor's Innovation Fund (CIF) Program, National Science Foundation (NSF) I-Corps Site, and Executives-in-Residence (XIR) Program. Amy is also responsible for building and maintaining OTCNV's collaborative relationships with ecosystem partners while also building and supporting NC State's startup pipeline. Amy earned a B.S. in Criminal Justice from East Carolina University.*

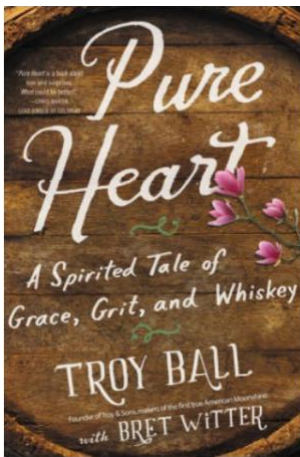
AWE is excited to have Stephanie on board!
